Introduction

As a language learner you need to be able to talk comfortably about past events, recent past events, current events, and future events.... in short, you have to be able to mix different grammatical tenses.

This Learning Pack consists of a podcast and worksheets which will help you do just that.

In this podcast Sue talks to Laura about her holiday in New York. Laura is almost at the end of her trip so you will notice that she uses the Past Tense to talk about what she did before her holiday, the Present Perfect tense to describe what she has done in the past few days and then the Present Continuous as a future to describe what she is doing later.

This Learning Pack is particularly suitable for Intermediate learners upwards.

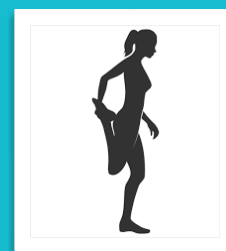

LESSON PLAN

Do the Warm Up to activate your knowledge and start to focus on necessary vocabulary.

Your main objective is to listen to how Laura and notice the different grammatical tenses she uses quite naturally.

Read the transcripts and complete the blanks in your understanding.

Finally, do the activities (preferably with a partner). Follow up and build your vocabulary with the links.

COMPREHENSION QUIZ

You will find the full quiz at the end of the Learning Pack, but first focus on these questions:

1. Where are Sue and Laura exactly during the podcast? What are they eating?
2. What does Laura say is her top tip for a tourist visit?
3. Which site was she a little disappointed with?

FOCUS ON GRAMMAR THIS PODCAST FOCUSES A LOT ON THE PRESENT PERFECT TENSE. LOOK AT THIS EXAMPLE:

- * more grammar exercises are available at the end of this Learning Pack.
- * I've done many things. (notice how Sue and Laura always use the contraction of the auxiliary « have »).
- * I've been to see the Empire State Building. I've spoken to some New Yorkers.
- * I've taken a few cabs. You've done so much.

TRANSCRIPT:

You can check your comprehension with the transcript. You will find the transcript at the end of the Learning Pack.

1. Pay attention to the words you have seen in the Focus on Grammar and Vocabulary section. Are these words new ? How can you use them in your conversation?
2. Listen again to the podcast and try to identify words that you didn't hear in the first time you listened.
3. Focus on words that you find difficult to pronounce. Repeat them until you feel comfortable with them.
